#### **NZQA Examination Fees**

NZQA charges a general fee of \$76.70. Year 13 Scholarship entries are \$30.00 each on top of the general fee. NCEA payments are required to be made **by Monday 30 July 2018**. The school cannot accept any payments after this date. Whānau will need to pay directly to NZQA who will then charge a \$50.00 late fee if not paid by their cut-off date.

#### **NZQA Financial Assistance Form**

For those that are eligible, the NZQA Financial Assistance form must be submitted to us no later than Monday 31 July 2018.

#### **Photos**

The whole school, sports teams & kapa haka photos will be taken on Friday, 10 August.

The class photo's, ordered last term, are expected to be distributed to your child by the end of August.

Students are required to wear their number 1's (formal dress uniform) for the whole school photo but can change into their everyday uniform once these have been taken. Students that do not have correct formal wear, will not be in the photos, however all students are still required to be at school.

#### Number 1's:

- **Boys:** Black dress pants white dress shirt school tie black school dress jersey black leather dress shoes black socks Plain Black belt.
- **Girls:** Black skirt white blouse school tie black school dress jersey black ladies dress shoes <u>FULL LENGTH DARK</u> black stockings.

## Jewellery with Number 1 Dress Uniform:

- Whakakai Pāua/Pounamu ANAKE.
- Taonga Māori ki te kaki.

#### Kākahu ā-kura/School Uniform (Everyday wear)

Kia maumahara e hoa mā, kei a tātou te kawenga kia mau i ngā kākahu e tika ana. Please ensure that correct uniform is being worn. Students who may need to wear, for example, a black skirt or incorrect shoes can get a uniform pass from the Tari. This is valid for 48 hours to allow for uniform to be repaired, cleaned or purchased if required.

#### Boys:

- School Grey Cargo shorts
- School polo shirt
- School jerseys & school jackets
- Black leather sandals slip on or not (NO JANDALS).
- Black socks- up to your calves in height (minimum) no ankle socks.
- Black <u>LEATHER</u> lace up <u>SCHOOL</u> shoe or dress shoes (No black sports shoes Nike, reebok etc.)
- Plain black scarves only.
- Plain Black cap no logo's or writing on the cap just a plain black cap.
- Plain Black Beanie for the winter there is no need for beanies in the summer.

#### Girls

- · Grey School skirt
- School polo shirt
- School jersey & school jackets
- Black leather sandals
- Black stockings or black socks- up to your calves in height (minimum)- no ankle socks s.
- Black leather dress or school shoes.
- Plain Black cap no logo's or writing on the cap just a plain black cap.
- Plain Black Beanie for the winter there is no need for beanies in the summer.

#### Please Note:

T-shirts worn underneath school Polo's must be worn in a tidy, respectable manner. If they are seen hanging scruffily, below the waistline area of the school polo, they will be removed and placed in the confiscation box in the school office.

#### The following will be the only alternative in the case of incorrect school uniform:

A pānui <u>MUST</u> be presented for students wearing the following alternative school uniform clothing. Failure to bring a note will result in the student being placed on kohi rāpihi DT and 5 demerit points. The following alternative clothing can only be used for the maximum of 2 days.

- Boys Black long dress trousers and white short sleeve polo shirt. There is no alternative jacket or jersey.
- Girls Black knee length skirt and white short sleeve polo shirt. There is no alternative jacket or jersey.

Please note that these are the only alternatives the students will have for everyday school uniform. Nothing else will be accepted at all, regardless of pānui from whānau.

IN THE CASE OF SHOES, IF THE STUDENT DOES NOT HAVE SANDALS, THEY WILL BE EXPECTED TO WEAR THE CORRECT, ACCEPTABLE, BLACK SCHOOL SHOES. IF THEY DO NOT HAVE THE CORRECT BLACK SCHOOL SHOES THEN IT IS EXPECTED THEY WILL BE WEARING SANDALS.
