It is of utmost importance that all uri (students, parents, whānau, coaches, managers, tutors and kaiwhakahaere of all Sports Teams, Te Whare Tū Taua and Te Whare Haka are guided by our core cultural values in all that we do:

PoUtuWhaKaAro		
Pono	Honesty, Reliability, Integrity	We are honest, reliable and can be trusted.
Tauutuutu	Reciprocity	We focus on positively giving back to kaupapa and others.
Whanaungatanga	Relationships	We positively maintain our relationships and welcome connecting to new people.
Kawenga	Responsibility	We are dependable, we make good choices, we are accountable.
Aroha	Love and Respect	We treat others respectfully.

The responsibilities of our uri/players/pia tū taua/kaihaka is to:

- Adhere to PoUtuWhaKaAro both on and off the field/court/water/stage/papa.
- Attend all training, practises, games, races, performances and gradings on time. When you are unable to attend, you need to contact the Coach, Manager, Tutor or Kaiwhakahaere.
- Take responsibility for your own nutrition water/snacks.
- Notify your Coach, Manager, Tutor or Kaiwhakahaere of the team/Ropū of any issues you may have.
- Adhere to the instructions of the Kaiwhakahaere.
- Look after and return the uniforms/taputapu.
- Contribute to the wider kaupapa (cleaning, dishes, asking others if the need help etc)
- Use appropriate and acceptable language.
- Be committed to your team/ropū.
- Be a good sport and uplift others.
- Pay all fees on time.

The responsibilities of the parents/caregivers is to:

- Ensure your tamaiti is able to attend practices, games, races, performances and gradings.
- Contact the kaiwhakahaere if your son/daughter/mokopuna is unable to make a practice, game, race, performance or grading, alternatively, your son/daughter/mokopuna can do this.
- Ensure uniform and equipment requirements are met.
- Discuss any issues with the Kaiwhakahaere.
- Remember that our Kaiwhakahaere are volunteers. Please be respectful to them.
- Pay fees on time.
- Attend hui when required.

The responsibilities of the spectators/whānau is to:

- Respect Official's/Kaiwhakahaere decisions.
- Respect and support opposition players/paddlers and other ropu.
- Uplift and support our uri and be generous with praise. Comments from the sideline/shore/viewing areas/audience need to be positive.
- Inappropriate language or behaviour is not acceptable.
- We are all representatives of our kura, our kaupapa and our people. Whānau/spectators are expected
 to uphold PoUtuWhaKaAro at all times when involved in our kaupapa.

The responsibilities of the Kaiwhakahaere (Coaches, Managers, Tutors, Kaiwhakahaere)

- Kia kaha ki te whakarangatira i te reo Māori ki ā tātou uri.
- Hāpai i ngā tikanga Māori.
- Adhere to and uphold PoUtuWhaKaAro at all times to represent our kaupapa well.
- Always use appropriate language when liaising with uri, whānau and peers.
- Be prepared to side-line uri who may display inappropriate behaviour and follow the school behaviour management system.
- Take into consideration other commitments and be reasonable with your requirements e.g. other sports training, tū taua, kapa haka and academic workload.
- Ensure lines of communication are clear with uri and their whānau.
- Treat all uri fairly and with respect.

HIDI

Discussions with uri and whānau need to take place at least two weeks prior to a tournament or event if
the uri will get minimal or no court/field/water/stage/papa time. We need to ensure we look after the
wairua of our uri and their whānau in a mana enhancing way. Support networks are also put in place to
provide support for our uri.
